## NEWCOMERS ARE NICE...Once You Get to Know Them Advice to Established Members

Having to talk with newcomers can be unnerving for some people, but we all share one thing in common – we were all, once upon a time, newcomers to the SCA. Somehow we survived the “newby” period to become the more “experienced” member. For many, orientation to the SCA was provided by a friend who was already a member, but nowadays more and more people are coming into the SCA by themselves. Therefore, many groups have an official host (chatelaine/hospitaller) whose main function is to meet new people, answer questions, give out literature and steer the newcomer to the appropriate resources. However, an official chatelaine should not exist so that no one else need bother with new people. The chatelaine supplements each individual member’s efforts to greet new faces.

### **How can you help welcome a new person?**

**First, go up and say hello.** If you are not that “old” in the group, ask if the person is new. Sometimes it is a veteran member who is showing up after a long absence! Sound pleased, but not gushy, that the new person was interested enough to come. New people have a need to be noticed. Greeting someone is an easy way to provide simple recognition. Keep in mind that you are probably far more comfortable in the SCA than the new person is. The SCA is **your** bailiwick. You can afford to provide the recognition the newcomer needs to feel more secure in the strange environment and be glad he or she came. This is known as courtesy to strangers, and dukes as well as commoners practice it.

**Introduce the new person to your friends and to those working on crafts.** The new person may not remember who they are, but perhaps the members will speak with the newcomer later in the meeting or at future meetings. Being left alone and ignored is very hard on a new person!

**Ask what the newcomer knows about the SCA.** That gives a place to start a conversation and to fill in some gaps in knowledge. Ask why they came to the SCA and listen with courtesy. Inquire about modern-day hobbies and interests. It may help you identify what areas they might like to know more about. When you want to go back to your business, suggest that they might like to look around and then come back to talk with you before they leave. Check back with them before the end of the meeting if they haven’t come back to you.

**Ask the person if you can explain what is going on.** Too often, established members will say, “If you have any questions, just ask,” and then walk away. New people often do not know what they want to know, or they may not have a question that they think is worth asking.

Instead, try something like, “Come with me while I...” and then explain what is going on. Experiment with:

- “May I explain...?”
- “Are you interested in...?”
- “What do you like to do?”
- “What are your interests/hobbies?”
- “Would you like to talk to someone about... (leatherworking, cooking, embroidery, fighting, armor, calligraphy, archery, costuming, music, brewing, etc.) ?”
- “What can I explain?”
- “May I introduce you to someone who knows about...?”

**Help the newcomer participate.** If the group is participating in some activity such as dancing, do be sure that you invite the newcomer. Don't wait for the dance leader to think of it. And don't expect that most newcomers will ask a member to dance! Remember, too, ladies, that if there are not enough lords, you can ask a female newcomer to dance with you. Use the nice touches of courtesy such as "my lord", "my lady" and polite gestures such as a slight bow or curtsy, especially if you are in garb. Being called "my lord" or "my lady" enhances the feeling of participation and offers a touch of confidence to the newcomer.

**See that newcomer information is available.** Arrange with the seneschal or chatelain/hospitaller to have newcomer material brought each week, such as a copy of the kingdom's newcomer booklet, the SCA's Forward into the Past, a copy of Tournaments Illuminated and/or your kingdom's newsletter. You might also want to have a copy of Compleat Anachronist, instructions for making simple garb, a photo album, and so forth. Include a local group handout listing meeting place and times, especially for guilds or interest groups, a contact person and phone number or e-mail address. Give out a copy of the group's newsletter. Bring an SCA membership form and an order form for items from the Stock Clerk.

**Get the newcomer's name and contact information.** Ask them to sign a "guest book" so that you have a way to contact them if they come to several meetings and then don't show up. Ask why they haven't been attending. Their reasons may be illuminating! With all this, keep in mind that a newcomer may suffer from overload. There is so much to see and learn! There are too many people doing too many quality pieces of handcrafts and the newcomer may feel as if he or she can never measure up to the experienced member's level of skill. Having been told something once is no guarantee that the new person heard it or will remember it. That is why brief, informal newcomer meetings can be so important and why continued, personal contact from you, the established member, is so vital to their continued participation.

May you never lack for something to say to a new person and may your group never lack a steady supply of new people!

# Council Minutes for March. 11, 2010

In attendance: Catriona, Dyon, Stjarna, Ysabella, Rowland, Thorgrim, Rowena, Arthur, Marcia, Inguz, Ulrik, Meaghan, Xarrmon, Eoin, Justin, Roth, Mairghread, Arianwen, Rontu, Einarr, Melissa, Viktoria

The meeting was called to order at 6:35 by Ysabella and a motion to approve the February minutes was made by Arthur, seconded by Meaghan, and approved by the Council.

## Old Business:

**May Crown:** Contract is signed and under review. Site fee needs to be paid by the Kingdom by April 23 and the deposit needs to be in next week. The Kingdom Exchequer is aware and the Kingdom check will be in shortly. Ysabella will walk the site with the fairgrounds person next week to see where we want dumpsters, etc. Anyone else from the autocrattng team is welcome to join them.

Classes are organized with three that Marcia has set up and also some spinning and wool prep classes will go on. Ysabella is checking to see if we can have one horse on site for the riderless horse ceremony. Hopefully we can arrange it without paying for the extra Equestrian insurance. The horse would have to remain in the trailer except for during the ceremony. Inguz will check with her friends who hosted horses the last time we had equestrian activities to see if maybe a local horse could be used for the ceremony.

## **Springfest:**

Ronan will organize the archery tournament since Bacchus can't attend. It will be a box tourney. Inguz will be there after all and will do court and wake up call, but Rowena will still be Herald in charge. Reservation payment was turned in. It will cost us 402.14 for up to 100 people. She also signed the contract for Baron's at the same price. The park will be charging a \$10.00 merchant fee and merchants need to contact the ranger in advance. There will also be a \$12.00 per night fee for RV's. This fee needs to be paid directly to the park.

**Portable Holes:** Rowland will have them finished by Crown.

## New Business:

**Eric Stakes:** Xarrman checked back at Pacific Steel and showed them what we want. The total price with tax will be 678.39, which includes taxes and shipping. (\$710 was approved last month.) He also checked on the price of 60 feet of half inch square stock for the foot pieces which will come to 39.24. Ulrik moved we approve the total for those 2 purchases, Rowland seconded and the motion passed.

**Pavilion:** Ambergard wants to borrow our pavilion for Oasis to use as a kitchen. Arthur will haul it up and supervise set up. Motion passed.

**Castle loan:** The college in Cranehaven has contacted us about borrowing the castle to use as a gate for the college's Ren Faire. We would need to haul and supervise set up. They won't have anyone to stay overnight and secure it Friday, so we would have to do that too. They would like us to quote a price for rental on those terms, but we don't have anyone who is willing to do the supervision needed. Ysabella will let them know that we can't manage the loan.

**Public Demo:** Possible dates being looked at are April 17<sup>th</sup>, May 8<sup>th</sup> and May 15<sup>th</sup>. April 17<sup>th</sup> was chosen. We are looking at a Saturday in Howard Amon Park in Richland. Desdamona has requested forms for Pasco and Kennewick school districts to distribute flyers to kids to get families interested. Catriona thought we need to make some decisions about how much we are willing to spend on flyers, since Pasco alone has more than 14,000 students. Some suggested just sending to Middle School age, Xarrmon thought that we need to hit highschoolers too. Roth might be able to print up to 1000 at work because they can print for nonprofit groups with approval. How about posters at the schools? That would have to be approved too. No real decision was made yet on

printing. Marcia will set up A&S for the demo and wanted to use the pop ups and tables from the trailer, which is at Arthur's.

### **Reports:**

**Baroness:** A teacher at Firen's school (Enterprise) wants a demo on the Medieval Renaissance era. She is flexible about the date since they just finished the medieval period and are heading into Renaissance. We discussed the possibility of April 16<sup>th</sup>, which is a Friday that Hanford has off. (Ulrik and Dyon could probably take time off.) Stjarna will check with the teacher and see if that date works for her. We discussed the idea of having some stations/presentations that kids might rotate through.

**Seneschal:** No new info from Kingdom. Remember that Oasis War is coming up this weekend.

**Reeve:** As of 2/28/20, we have 3744.21 in checking and 1442.64 in savings. Be sure to photocopy any receipts that you are turning in. He will no longer accept any that are not.

**Chamberlain:** Old plywood panels from the Port-a-Tav are in her yard and she wants to get rid of them. Everyone was fine with trashing them. Xarrmon may pick them up or Ulrik will take to the dump.

**Chronicler:** has turned in receipt for 54.15 for photocopies for the Word. (5000 copies for \$50.00 which should cover about 5 months of issues.)

**Webmaster:** The district has changed over to a new server.

**Heralds:** Went to practice last week and will be there again next week to consult. She will be at Pages/Sgts on the 21<sup>st</sup>. Ysabella reminded members to check their awards and let Inguz know if you see any missing awards.

**Chief Scribe:** Marcia has done 2 Blasted Tree charters with some new wording. Arthur still needs people to work on scrolls.

**Marshal:** No practice on March 30<sup>th</sup> due to Spring Break. Practice will start outdoors again in Howard Amon Park on the first Tuesday in May. Rowena has purchased some gauge pins for drop testers to test fabric for rapier clothing. Jack will organize a workshop for those who want to make one. Arthur is going to make a sample and maybe host the workshop in his shop. Ulrik is putting in an order for Fiberglass pikes. They cost \$40 plus \$5 for shipping and an additional \$20 for the end kit for the tip. Contact Ulrik to get in on the order.

**Youth Armored Combat:** Nothing to report.

**Archery:** Might start shooting at Xarrmon's, maybe coordinating with the Sundays that pages meet. We won't start in March because there is a bit more to be worked out.

**Lists:** Nothing to report.

**Chatelaine:** Has submitted a demo flyer to be approved by the Kingdom Chatelaine. (See earlier info about demo.)

**Greenwood:** Xarrmon and Desi need to know if anyone has gotten the contract. Ysabella will call Marjorie and check on the contract and where we will be located since there is a new concrete pad in the area where we have been located.

**Gold Key:** has sorted some of the loaner costume tubs and made one men's and one women's tub that will fit in the trailer. She has also been working with a group on the rapier tabards and needs the drapery weights to finish them up.

**Greteboke:** Nothing to report.

**Minister of Children:** She is working with the Kingdom Minster of Children to come up with some activities for Crown.

**Pages:** March meeting will be on Heraldry. Chivalry and Comportment will be presented in April at the demo. She has set up Pages and the Barony as Facebook groups. She is sending out questions to the pages on Facebook but so far they haven't been too good about responding.

**A&S:** She has also been working with a group on the rapier tabards and have 4 about finished. They need the drapery weights to finish them up. Mairghread will run a scribal contest for Crown. There will be prizes for different categories like Calligraphy, Illumination, Goldwork, etc. There will also be a display for any kind of non paper scroll- rock, wood, skin, etc. She hasn't been contacted to set up anything for the Kingdom A&S officer yet.

**Ithra Chancellor:** Has 3 classes organized for Crown: Lecture class on cooking, Games, and Dance. She will run a documentation class in the fall.

**First Aider:** Roth will make sure that things are restocked by Springfest.

**Librarian:** He has found copies of Queen Carol's Guide on Ebay. The cost works out to about \$3.50 each. He will buy a dozen and sell them to those that are interested. Any leftover can be purchased by the Barony for the library.

He also had lock washers to make a decision on which to use with eric stakes. After a little discussion this was put aside to be discussed by an interested group after the meeting.

**Canton:** Nothing to report.

**Next meeting:** The next council meeting will be at 6:30 at the Pasco Roundtable on April 8<sup>th</sup> rather than in the Canton, so that the autocrating team can meet after the regular meeting.

**Note:** After the meeting was closed, Arthur realized that he needed to get a spare tire for the trailer before hauling the pavilion tomorrow. There was still a quorum of officers left, so it was approved to give Arthur a check that can be written for the cost of the tire.

**MERCHANTS:** Please contact Tova so that I can figure out where to put your booth. Remember that if you don't have an Idaho Vendor's license, then our Merchant Steward will have the appropriate paperwork for you.

**PARKING:** Shuttle will be provided to outer non-fee parking lot as we have done in past years. Those camping with a large group will be allowed to keep one car in the camping area to help with shuttling your own group. Cars remaining in C-loop must be careful to only parked in paved areas - meaning stay off the grass to make the park rangers happy.

**DOGS:** You all know how to camp with pets. Please make sure they are happy and quiet for your neighbors and of course pick up after them. Make sure your pets are upto date on shots and are wearing appropriate tags.

Please note this is a State Park so there are **FLUSHIES** and **SHOWERS** in the bathrooms in the camp site restrooms.

**CABINS:** Cabins rent for **\$50 per night** each plus Idaho State Sales Tax. There is a **\$10 reservation fee**. Call the Reserve America at 1-888-922-6743 to make cabin reservations at Hells Gate State Park in Lewiston. **FOR MORE DETAILS ON CABINS, DIRECTIONS, ETC, CHECK THE KINGDOM CALENDAR AT** <http://www.antir.sca.org/Upcoming/index.php?aaa=b>

**Camp Cabin Amenities:** The one-room unit sleep up to five on bunk beds and futons - bring your own bedding. The cabins are equipped with electricity, heat and A/C, lockable windows and doors. Cook outside on the grill-covered fire pit. You can setup one tent outside of your cabin. Central restrooms. Each cabin includes parking for one vehicle. Extra cars cost extra per night unless moved to the outer lot.

There are 8 cabins at Hells Gate. The 4 cabins nearest Honor War are located between the B & C camp loop are **Locust, Sycamore, Maple, and Pondersa** (closest to the C-loop). The 3 cabins between the A & B loop are **Sacajewea, Lewis and Clark** (closest to the B-loop) and the furthest cabin in the middle of the A-loop is **Tammany**. If you end up in one of these distant cabins, then you will want to drive back and forth between these distant cabins and Honor War in the C-loop.

Please email Autocrat tova@cableone.net and let me know which cabin you have reserved. She will pickup your cabin key before the park office closes at 4pm on Friday so that you can get your cabin key as soon as you sign-in at our SCA gate.

**Camp trailers or RVs** - The C-loop does not have any RV hook-ups. If you park in the C-loop, then please park north of the bathrooms. If you need/want electricity and water hook-ups, then these are available in the adjacent B-loop for an extra \$10/night. Please contact the autocrat so that she can reserve a spot. You will still need to goto the C-loop SCA gate to pay.

**Championship Tournaments:** Spring also brings the opportunity to test your mettle against others for the title of Champion of Heavy and Youth fighters.

**Camping Info:**

The city requests no stakes longer than 10". Water is available on site, flushies and no showers. Above ground fires only, 12" please.

**After dark - Curfew for children, aged 12 and under:** Children must remain in their family's encampment OR be in the company of their parents (trips to biffy excluded). The site is near a river and is too dangerous for children to be wandering around unattended after dark.

**Midnight - 6 a.m. Quiet Hours:** No drumming or loud activities in the encampment commons. Late night Bardic activities may be held at the Autocrat's discretion.

**RV Information:** RVs can be parked in the general parking area for the event for free There are no hook-ups in the general area. If hook-ups are needed, the fee is \$15 per day and the hook-up area is at the fairgrounds just a few blocks away from the event. Please e-mail the autocrat ASAP for a form to fill out for the fairgrounds.

**Pets:** All pets on site will need proof of vaccination. Please be prepared to show proof of vaccination at the gate. Pets without proof of vaccination will not be allowed on site. Owners will be required to pick up after their pets. Please leave loud or aggressive animals at home. Mundane leash laws apply.

**Misc. Site Info:** There is limited electricity available on site with medical needs a priority. Please bring extension cords and try to limit crock pot use.
